Weihnachtszeit

The time before the holidays has a very special feeling to the people in Bavaria who enjoy getting together with friends and family for a delicious meal and to chat and review the events of the past year.

Here at the Bavarian Grill, we are proud to offer some of the same holiday favorites that Bavarians have been enjoying for years. They include Schweins Haxe, a whole juicy, slow-roasted ham hock brushed with Salvator Doppelbock to give it the crispy skin. It is traditionally served with bread dumplings and red cabbage. Our favorite Bavarian holiday treat is Gänsebraten — one quarter of an oven-roasted goose with a nice dark, crispy skin. We suggest bread dumplings and red cabbage.

Another holiday favorite is enough for two to share. To prepare Eisbein auf Ananaskraut, we cure a giant ham hock in a special salty brine and simmer it in Sauerkraut until tender. It's served

with split pea puree and mashed potatoes. Seafood lovers will enjoy our Bratfisch, a juicy filet of flounder, breaded and sautéed to a golden brown, served with mashed potatoes and our mixed salad .

To enjoy a Bavarian holiday dessert tradition try our Glühwein Grütze, war berries in a spiced, mulled red wine from Nürnberg, topped with whipped cream.

Zum Aufwärmen — Good-bye cold feet! The Bavarian Christmas Markets in Nürnberg, Würzburg and München are famous for the enticing aroma, which wafts through the chilly air; and coming from Glühwein, a warm, spiced, mulled red wine. Or, for even warmer feet, try the authentic Austrian Jägertee — a fruity combination of distillates and hot tea.

Did you know that...?

🔪 **The first appearance** of a Christmas tree (Tannenbaum) was recorded in Germany in 1605 although the tradition dates back to the 16th century when the first "Tannenbaum" ballads appeared in print.

By the 19th century the tradition had spread across Germany and abroad. It was due to the royal Germans that the custom of decorating a tree for Christmas crossed German borders and reached the United States.

As is our custom during the holidays, the Bavarian Grill will feature good food and drink along with festive decorations, complete with a traditional Tannenbaum. 🍷

🔪 **New Year's Eve** for Germans, many of whom know the night as Holy Sylvester, has always been a time of eating, drinking, dancing and singing. The holiday gets its name from Pope Sylvester I, who, according to legend, healed from leprosy and baptized the Roman Emperor Constantine the Great.

Many Germans celebrate noisily and merrily at "Sylvester Balls." At midnight glasses are filled with champagne or wine and toasts and hugs go with wishing each other "ein gutes neues Jahr."

Bavarian Grill New Year's Eve Activities

As the year 2002 ends, our guests like to celebrate. These are our offers to bring in 2003 at the Bavarian Grill.

1. Neujahr in München

Join us in welcoming in the New Year in Munich at 5 p.m. Plano time. This popular event features a 4-p.m. seating in the Restaurant with a special New Year's Eve menu priced a la carte and music provided by the Alpenmusikanten Band playing from 4:30 until 7:30 p.m. Reservations are suggested.

2. New Year's Eve Party in Plano

This event focuses on bringing in 2003. Seating starts at 8:15 p.m. A special menu features four different appetizers, choice of two soups or two salads, four different entrees, any dessert of the dessert menu and a gulasch soup after midnight. The price of \$99 per couple includes a welcome Bier at the bar and the champagne toast at midnight. Entertainment will be provided by the Alpenmusikanten. A deposit of \$50 per person is required with the reservation.

3. Bavarian Bier Jazz in the Biergarten

Just as it does every Tuesday night, the four-piece Bavarian Bier Jazz Band will play Dixieland tunes in the Biergarten from 7 p.m. until about 12:30 a.m. This will be first come, first seating with a special New Year's Eve menu that offers various a la carte choices. Reservations are encouraged.

4. A la carte dining while Jake Kons plays the accordion in the "Jäger Stube"

We will seat the arriving guests starting at 4:30 p.m. to dine from the special New Year's Eve a la carte menu. Seating will continue throughout the evening as guests arrive and others leave. Reservations are suggested, and walk-ins are welcome. 🍷
